
# GIRLS SOCCER FINISHES STRONG

This year we added a twist. We had the Classic Champions, but we added a 4 hole play-off among the leaders of all the flights. We'll see you next summer!


### TENNIS CLENCHES 3RD PLACE AT STATE A TOURNAMENT

### **Our Mission**

VHS Athletic Booster Club believes athletics and extracurricular activities are a large part of the learning environment. It is the goal of the VHS Athletic Booster Club to assist school funding to support athletic facilities and programs.

The VHS Athletic Booster Club was founded to contribute fundraising to support athletics, upgrade sports facilities, promote spirit, and to assist at sporting events.

- · Grant two scholarships each year to athletes

# WHAT WE DON'T DO

- · Meals for games or teams
- Decorations for locker rooms, lockers, or the creation of individual signs or banners
- Set-up and/or schedule send-off events, welcome home parties, pep rally events, or fan buses
- Uniforms/attire with names or anything kept by the athletes

Booster members may lend support to these endeavors, but the Booster Club is not solely responsible for the organization or provision of those items listed above.

#### What does the Booster Club do and provide?

We provide financial support to VHS athletic teams that is not already provided by the school general budget.

#### How is financial support from the Booster Club requested?

Each athletic team's head coach can request financial support via a standardized form that is then acted upon by the Booster Club at their monthly meetings. Coaches are highly encouraged to attend monthly meetings to discuss their requests. Requests from parents will not be acted upon.

# What are examples of financial support provided by the Booster Club?

- Team camps
- Athletes to attend camps that they would otherwise not be unable to attend because of cost
- Equipment (not covered by school funds or in partnership with the school)
- Additional team uniform attire or team gear
- Additional hotel costs or sports-specific costs related to state events above and beyond what is paid for by the school (i.e. golf practice rounds)
- Charter bus requests
- Spirit items (e.g. mascot, rally towels, spirit sticks, "themed" shirts) for cheerleaders and student sections to help promote student body involvement at athletic events
- Provision of annual Booster Club Scholarship available to apply for by senior athletes

# How does the Booster Club provide financial support for charter bus requests?

The Booster Club will decide the funding amount to be allocated for the year for charter bus requests. This amount will be communicated to the coaches and Athletic Director upon agreement of funds allocated, if requested and approved. Any additional funds above the school costs and Booster Club costs would be at the expense of the team parents or outside donors.

#### I'm a parent of a high school athlete. How is my studentathlete's team represented on the Booster Club?

The Booster Club highly encourages every team to designate a team representative (such as a parent) that attends booster meetings and then can disseminate meeting information to the team coach, athletes, and parents.

#### When does the Booster Club meet?

Meetings are held the first Wednesday of every month at 6:00 pm in the high school library.

Who can attend Booster Club meetings?

Everyone is welcome!

The Vermillion boys' and girls' cross country teams celebrated a remarkable season marked by strong performances and significant achievements. Both teams claimed victory at the Elk Point Jefferson Invitationals and advanced to the state meet in Rapid City.

The boys' team delivered an impressive performance, finishing 6th overall and earning a spot on the podium. The 2024 football season was filled with remarkable achievements both on and off the field. This marks Rollie's second consecutive year as an All-State linebacker, while Connor celebrated his first All-State selection as a wide receiver.

Additional All-Conference honors were awarded to teammates Dain Richardson, Elijah Lara, and Cameron Bottolfson, showcasing the team's depth of talent and dedication.

These honors reflect the incredible work ethic and commitment of our student-athletes to excellence in athletics and academics.



Great games were had this year like our Homecoming Victory with a commanding 20-0 win over Milbank featured standout performances from Ryne Chapman, who rushed for 230 yards and 2 touchdowns on 37 carries. Defensively, the team held Milbank to just 125 total yards of offense. We also had some amazing road games, particularly the nail-biting 15-14 victory over Tri-Valley anchored by Trequin Thomas, who delivered an unforgettable performance with 3 interceptions.

### **Notable Player Statistics**

- Hayden Christopherson: Passed for 1,243 yards, including a record-breaking 393-yard game against Canton.
